RANGE BAGS AND CART TOWELS

We have recently noticed an increasing number of cart towels and range bags not being returned after use. While we understand these items can sometimes be taken inadvertently, we want to remind everyone that these are club owned amenities meant to be shared among all Members.

GOLF

The continued removal of towels and range bags creates a significant and unnecessary cost.

We kindly ask that you take a moment to check your cars, golf bags, and lockers at home for any club towels or range bags that may have been taken by mistake. If you do find any, we would greatly appreciate their prompt return. Thank you for your cooperation and continued support in helping us maintain the quality and service you expect at the club.

BAG STORAGE

We've had a few recent incidents where golf bags have fallen in the storage area. Most often due to how full and bulky some bags have become. While we can't say for certain that fallen bags or broken clubs was caused by this, overstuffed bags have been a common factor in these situations as the golf bags do not fit securely in the designated area.

To help prevent damage and ensure a safer, more efficient storage system, we kindly ask that all Members clean out their golf bags by removing any non-essential items, such as:

- Extra golf balls
- Old towels, gloves, or clothing
- Unused accessories in side pockets

Reducing excess items will help bags fit better in the bins, limit their overall weight, and reduce the risk of tears or strain from heavy loads.

All this rain has made it tough to stay ahead of the weeds, which are popping up like crazy. We're a little behind on weed control, but we're working hard to catch up and appreciate your patience.

from the hurricane. My goal is always to lay less sod each year, and while we can't control hurricanes, we did see less winter kill than in years past. We'll keep working to strengthen the turf and remove things contributing to winter damage (like trees in the wrong spots).

You've probably noticed the sand wasps are back in the bunkers. This happens every year, and while we keep trying to find something that works long-term, nothing has stuck yet. Thankfully, they aren't aggressive and don't pose a threat to people. On the bright side, they do help control other insects that can hurt the turf and trees.

The crew has also been busy laying sod- between the winter kill on #10 and #15, and of course the damage

SUMMER IN THE BLUE RIDGE: A CHEF'S SEASON AT HENDERSONVILLE COUNTRY CLUB

In Western North Carolina, summer doesn't just arrive—it rolls in slowly, like the morning fog over the Blue Ridge Mountains. By June, the rhododendrons bloom, the farmers' markets overflow with color, and the days stretch long and golden. For chefs working at country clubs nestled in this landscape, summer is both a celebration and a challenge.

At our country club tucked into the hills, summer is the heartbeat of the year. The golf course buzzes from sunrise to dusk, the pool fills with families, and the calendar becomes a carousel of events—member-guest weekends, cuisine on the green, and third of July fireworks that light up the ridgeline and Laurel Park, and behind it all, we're in the kitchen, sweating the details—literally and figuratively.

Mornings begin with the scent of local sausage sizzling on the flat top at the Grill and the comforting rhythm of biscuits coming out of the oven. We make compotes from scratch using strawberries grown right down the road and steep fresh herbs from the club garden into syrups for lemonade and cocktails. Appalachian foodways run deep here, and Members expect menus that honor those roots while offering a touch of refinement.

Summer means a bounty of ingredients, and we try to showcase it all: mountain trout caught in nearby streams, Silver Queen corn, vine-ripened tomatoes, wild ramps (if we're lucky to still have some)... don't worry, we have them...and handpicked blueberries. We use sorghum to glaze pork belly, and serve apple cobbler with hand spun ice cream. The flavors are bold and rustic, but never fussy—just like the land itself.

Of course, the work is demanding. When you're grilling steaks for 48 Members under a tent on a 85-degree evening or trying to keep a five-course tasting menu on track during a power flicker, the pressure is real. But there's something deeply satisfying about serving food that reflects both the season and the place.

Out here I've come to notice people appreciate tradition. You can taste it in a pot of slow-cooked collards or some cornbread with crispy edges. But they also welcome creativity—pickled green beans instead of olives in a Bloody Mary, or a touch Asian inspired southern flare. It's a balancing act that keeps us inspired all summer long.

More than anything, what sets a summer in Hendersonville apart is the connection to the community. Many of our Members grew up in these hills. They bring their families, share their stories, and trust us to make their memories even more meaningful. That's a privilege that doesn't get old, no matter how hot the kitchen gets.

Summer here is intense, rewarding, and deeply rooted in the land. And for a chef in Western North Carolina, there's no place we'd rather be than behind the line, cooking with heart and honoring the flavors of these mountains.
